Minutes It was proposed by R Houseman and seconded by M Worsnop and **RESOLVED** that the minutes of the proceedings of the Ordinary meeting held on 27th April 2023 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman

Approved Certificate of Exemption and Annual Governance Statement proposed by C Packer and seconded by R Houseman that the statements be accepted all were in favour and signed by the Chairman and RFO

County Councillor Nathan Hull – Reported he had received a reply from Hashmat Ghaznawl Project Engineer NYCC Highways and Transportation regarding the pinch point on Wreaks Road. The Engineer stated they had carried out a site visit but had not informed Nathan or our Chairman about the visit. Nathan replied to the Engineer saying he noted the points regarding parking near junctions and also near to dropped kerbs and that this may constitute a parking contravention but also saying whilst the Engineer had a good knowledge of the Traffic Management Act 2004 unfortunately the same cannot necessarily be said of those who commit parking violations. Additionally, finding a Police Officer who is available to come out to a rural village such as Birstwith and move offending vehicles and/or issue a Fixed Penalty Notice is unrealistic. What we are effectively asking for here is to put down a small section of double yellow lines on the main road near the "pinch point". The reason for this is clear in that people invariably understand that they cannot park on double yellow lines and therefore do not park on them. Unless this happens there will come a time that some inconsiderate driver parks his car at the pinch point in such a way that the road will be too

narrow for an emergency vehicle to get through. Nathan again asked for an onsite meeting with the Chairman and himself to move this matter forward. Nathan has to arrange a meeting with Mr Crowther Hirst Lane re drainage problems. The first planning committee meeting of the new council will be held in Ripon. Kex Gill well under way and the trees are being replanted. The opening date for the Hydro is now August after its refurbishment. The local 24 bus fares remain the same until October when they will be slightly increased. Nathan again urged us all to use the bus service otherwise we may loose it.
